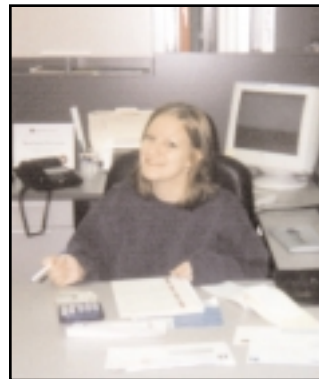
Meet Camp Winnebago's new Administrative Assistant

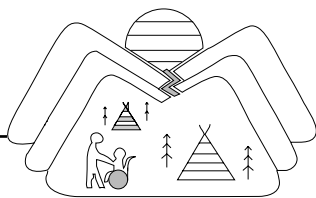

Camp started on June 6th with a week of orientation for our staff. This year Camp Winnebago employed over 50 staff in all. Fortunately, Cathy Greeley, our camp director at the time, got the budget under control.

Then we got lucky, we received two large sums of money. One was a gift and the other was an estate. We started a fundraiser among the Lions Clubs and the Lions Clubs of district 5M1 rose to the challenge. We had enough funds to start construction, and once we announced that we were going ahead with the new building, new funds came in. That is the reason that the present board was successful in raising the funds.

I want to thank the Friendship Wagon Train that rides for Camp Winnebago. Their support is invaluable to Camp. They are such a fun group and I always enjoy talking with them. Without their support, there would be no new building at Camp.

I want to thank Al Favert for all the work he has done for Camp. He headed up the Lions Fund Raising and was chairperson of the building committee. He spent many extra hours working with the contractor. He also is replacing me as President of the Board. I know I am leaving the Board in good hands.

I want to thank Theresa Burroughs for agreeing to become our present director. Camp is fortunate to have such a dedicated person as our director. She has made a

strong impact on Camp and has done a wonderful job this past summer.



Also, I would like to thank Julie Arney, Gail Meyer, and Marcia Murray for their services to Camp Winnebago. They all have completed their 6-year terms. Julie is a member of the LaCrescent Lions Club and has actually been on the board for 9 years. She served three years as Lion Liaison. Gail is also with A.B.L.E. and her expertise working with the developmentally disabled was a strong asset for the Board. Marcia is also from La Crescent and has always been a willing volunteer for all the camp activities.
